

Episcopal Parishes Leave Church

Last month, two parishes in Virginia voted to leave the Episcopal Church, citing disapproval over allowing homosexuals to join the American branch of the worldwide Anglican Communion. These two may be joined by five others in Virginia as well. Four other parishes have already left and three more are expected to announce their decision soon. Episcopal Church leaders have been telling their members that there is room for everyone. Most of the breakaway churches in Virginia are joining the Convocation of Anglicans in North America, an offshoot of the Nigerian church.

Although there many reasons to disapprove of the Episcopal Church, at least they made the biblically correct decision this time (Romans 1:26-27; 1 Corinthians 6:9-10; Jude 7), instead of trying to be politically correct.
