- There is no training that I would refuse which would increase my abilities for work satisfaction. I will accept serious responsibilities and duties. My education will be expensive, but I know what your church requires, and I will set my course to gain the knowledge which will benefit your company.
- I get along superbly with people by being a good listener and assistant and my greatest qualification is that I am a quick learner and continue my studies to improve my work skills.
- Teachers and instructors (see references) rate my integrity, honesty, zeal, and conduct as excellent.

Are you using your "talents" and being faithful to your duties? Your life is a living resume which will be reviewed on the day of judgment by Christ. Do not forget your first love (Revelation 2:4)! Are you ready for inspection and the test for an eternal place in heaven (2 Corinthians 13:5)? Only the serious should apply, because there will be no inheritance in Heaven without commitment to God.
